

The ROX mission is "to create generations of confident girls who are in control of their own relations, experiences, decisions and futures." ROX is an evidence-based 20 week small-group program for $5^{th} - 12^{th}$ grade girls, and implemented in schools strictly by ROX -trained facilitators. Overarching skills taught through the program are assertiveness, leadership opportunities, and how to respond to hard challenges. ROX exists in 24 U.S. states, and continues to expand. Our speaker, Ann Bischoff CEO of Star House, spoke about the 24 hour drop- in center for young people ages 14-24 and the work that Star House does in the community.

Two of the Grant-in-Aid recipients spoke about how they used their funds. Paige Biglin purchased visuals, cards, and incentive materials in her work as a speech therapist. Samantha Hurdzan purchased book bins and carts for use in her 2nd grade classroom.

Minutes of the January meeting were approved after a date correction. The date for the February meeting should have read Feb. 7th instead of Feb. 6th.

In the **Treasurer's Report**, Dorene Henschen reported that \$700 was taken from the Grant-in-Aid fund and put in checking so that the \$100 awards could be sent to the recipients. One check to Elizabeth Jassy hasn't been received so a new check will be issued. The January ending balance in checking is \$3914.40.

In **Unfinished Business**, members were reminded to register on-line for the OSO convention in April at the Embassy Suites in Dublin. The chapter will reimburse members the registration fee. Other costs need to be paid by the members.

Feminine hygiene products can be brought to the next meeting and will be given to a Grant-in-Aid applicant.

World Fellowship contributions can be made at the March meeting or mailed in.

Proceeds from the Agora at OSO will go to the Grant-in-Aid Fund.

For Founders' Day, Michele Koenig is working on ornaments with roses and the DKG emblem as table favors. Need to check how much money was spent last year for entertainment and decorations. Each chapter sends in \$60 to cover these costs. Items will be brought to the March meeting for assembling.
