

" Linda Ruehrmund graduated from Cardington High School in 1962 and went on to receive her Bachelor's Degree in Elementary Education from Capital University. She was employed at Columbus City Schools for her entire 30-year teaching career teaching fourth, fifth, and sixth grades over that period. She achieved her Master's Degree in Disciplinary Education from the University of Dayton. After she retired, Ruehrmund became a substitute teacher for Cardington-Lincoln Local Schools for eight years. Her community involvement has been impeccable by being an active member in the Morrow County Retired Teachers Association, Delta Kappa Gamma International Society, Chester Arbor Gleaners, and Friends of Cardington. She is a lifelong member of Saint John Windfall Lutheran Church and took part in many ministries such as the Sunday School Board, Lutheran Social Services Auxiliary, and directed the church's adult and youth choirs.
