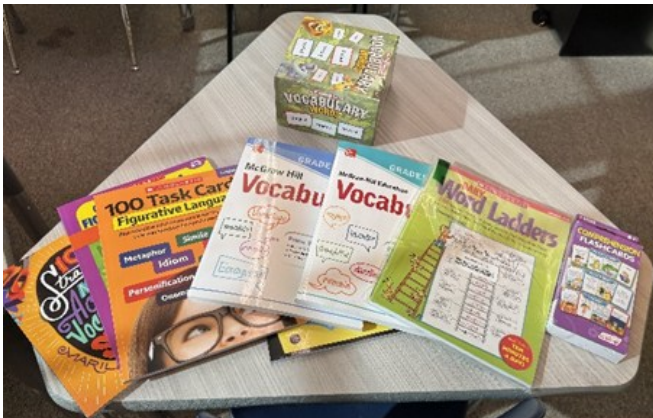
GRANT-IN-AID

Gamma tried a new method of gathering Grant-in-Aid applicants this year. Emeri Ferguson, Grant-in-Aid chairwoman, created and shared a Google Form application that lets teachers answer and submit their applications electronically. We had 22 people respond. Michele Koenig, Dorene Henshen, Judy Valentine, and Emeri Ferguson went over all of the applications and decided on 10 Grant-in-Aid recipients. Each were sent \$100 checks to support their teaching. We look forward to hearing from them as to how our gift has helped them in the classroom. Recipients who present to our chapter will receive a second \$100 award this summer for additional support for their teaching careers.

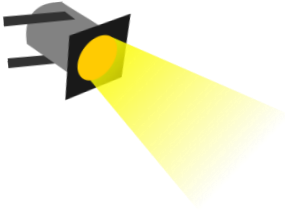

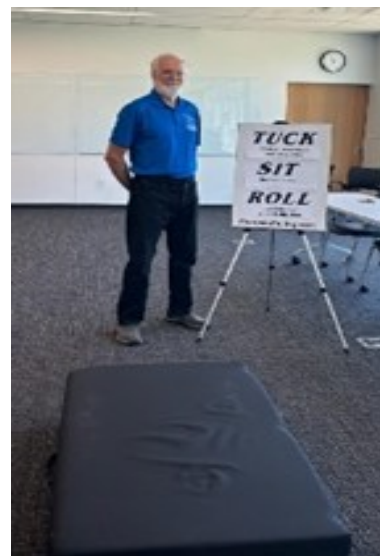

MARCH 8, 2025
