Diane has two books for teachers: Time Saving Art Projects for the Busy Teacher, Book 1 and Book 2. Each book has more than 20 art projects that use the same patterns. Although teachers will need to make copies of the patterns for each child or group, they only have to be made once! After the patterns are made and labeled they can be used for the projects. There are many ways these can be used in class. Some suggestions: sorting, tracing, following directions, shapes, measurement, learning stations, and in art class.

She also has three children's books: Mister Mean Bean, The Checkered Elephant, and Alice, The Talking Christmas Tree. Mister Mean Bean is about bullying—the characters are unique and abstract so that they do not resemble any child reading the book. Mister Mean Bean learns how to treat others by following the example set by his friends. The Checkered Elephant is a feel good story about friendship. Children follow the adventures of Alex, the checkered elephant and his friends. Her newest book is Alice, The Talking Christmas Tree. This book is based on an actual Christmas decoration that was in a store window in downtown Wheeling, West Virginia, for many years. It tells the story of how Alice came to Wheeling, her travels, and triumphant return home to Wheeling!

She is active in Psi Chapter. She does their yearbook, newsletter, and makes Christmas stockings for members to fill for a local charity.

NORTHEAST REGIONAL—GET YOUR PASSPORT READY!

Come to the Northeast Regional Conference July 12-14 at Caesars Resort and Convention Center in Windsor, Ontario.

The Northeast Regional Conference will be one day shorter than the other regionals as International is responding to evaluations that suggested shortening the regionals. The registration fee is \$113 (U.S. dollars) for the three days and \$50 for one day. But the registration form will be listed in Canadian dollars, and, therefore, those living in the U.S. will need to use a credit card to register. The credit card bill will then list the cost in U.S. dollars, which because of the exchange rate is less than Canadian dollars.

Caesars Resort, the conference site located across the river from Detroit, is a lovely facility. Rooms are in the Augustus Tower, and the meetings are on a lower level in the same tower. Reserving a room in late spring, may require you to select lodging in the Forum Tower which requires a short walk through the Casino to the conference. Lodging is \$165 in Canadian dollars per night. Multiply \$165 by .75 to get the approximate cost of the room in U.S. dollars: \$123.75.

Why do we have regional conferences?

We can get the latest information about the Society, and we can experience professional and personal development through speakers, breakout sessions, and other activities. Plus we see another geographical area.

Earlier in the week (Mon., Tues., and Wed.) preconference training will be provided for state organization presidents and other specific state leaders. International meetings are wonderful places to enjoy "genuine spiritual fellowship" with women from other countries and states in the U.S. So think very seriously about attending the Northeast Regional. Some members from the Northeast have already volunteered to help Ontario's 150 members. Members who are musical and enjoy singing and playing instruments are invited to participate. Susan Young from Illinois will be directing the chorus along with seeking individuals to perform at various sessions.

Porter Airlines offers a discount from major cities and Canada to Toronto where going through customs is required, and then it's only a 20-minutes flight to Windsor. On other airlines through Detroit, it is only about 30 minutes by shuttle to arrive at Windsor after going through customs. You do Two pre-conference sessions—The Underground Railway which ended at Windsor and Indigenous Peoples in the 21st Century--will be offered on Wednesday, July 12. Professional development hours will be available.

need a passport! No one gets in to Canada with a gun--not even one that a husband or friend may have left in the trunk of your car. When passing through customs, if you are asked why you are entering Canada, say you are attending a teachers' conference.

NE REGIONAL CONVENTION INSERT: TRAVEL PLANS FOR THE NORTHEAST REGIONAL CONFERENCE

As we are into the new year, you may now be thinking seriously about those travel plans to attend the Northeast Regional Conference in Windsor on July 12-14. Perhaps you have already decided to come a day early.

How are you traveling? If by auto or air from the US, remember to bring your passport. If flying Porter Airlines from Canada or one of these cities in the US— Boston, MA; Burlington, VT; Chicago (Midway); Newark, NJ; Pittsburgh, PA; Washington DC (Dulles)--Porter is offering a 15 per cent discount to those going to the Northeast Regional Conference and returning between July 7 and July 17. CA&promocode=NRC017. If booking through a travel agent the Code is NRC017. From US, you will clear immigration on Toronto Island (aka Billy Bishop) rather than Toronto Pearson. Turnaround time is about 20 minutes and then you will fly on to Windsor.



Do you wish to reserve a room now in the Augustus Tower of Caesars Resort and Convention Center? Call the hotel's Reservation Department at 1-800-991-8888 and identify yourself as being part of Delta Kappa Gamma with the group code of ADE0708. The room rate of \$165 in Canadian dollars (about \$123 in US dollars) is good from July 8 to July 16.

If coming early to Windsor, you might enjoy attending one of the pre-conference seminars, which will be held in the morning and afternoon of July 12. The Underground Railway features Elise Harding-Davis, an author and a descendant of slaves who escaped to Canada. Windsor was one of the destination cities in the underground railway. In the afternoon participants in this seminar will be taken to the sights outside of Windsor from those days in the mid-1800's.

The other seminar, Indigenous Peoples of the 21st Century, will focus on the history of the residential schools that were founded years ago to teach Indigenous students. Unfortunately, these children were taken miles away from their families and suffered many problems that remain with them today. Charlene Bearhead, a survivor of one of those schools and now the education officer for the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, will share her past experiences and ways Indigenous students are being helped today. 
